

Number 1 looks right at home on BSA.

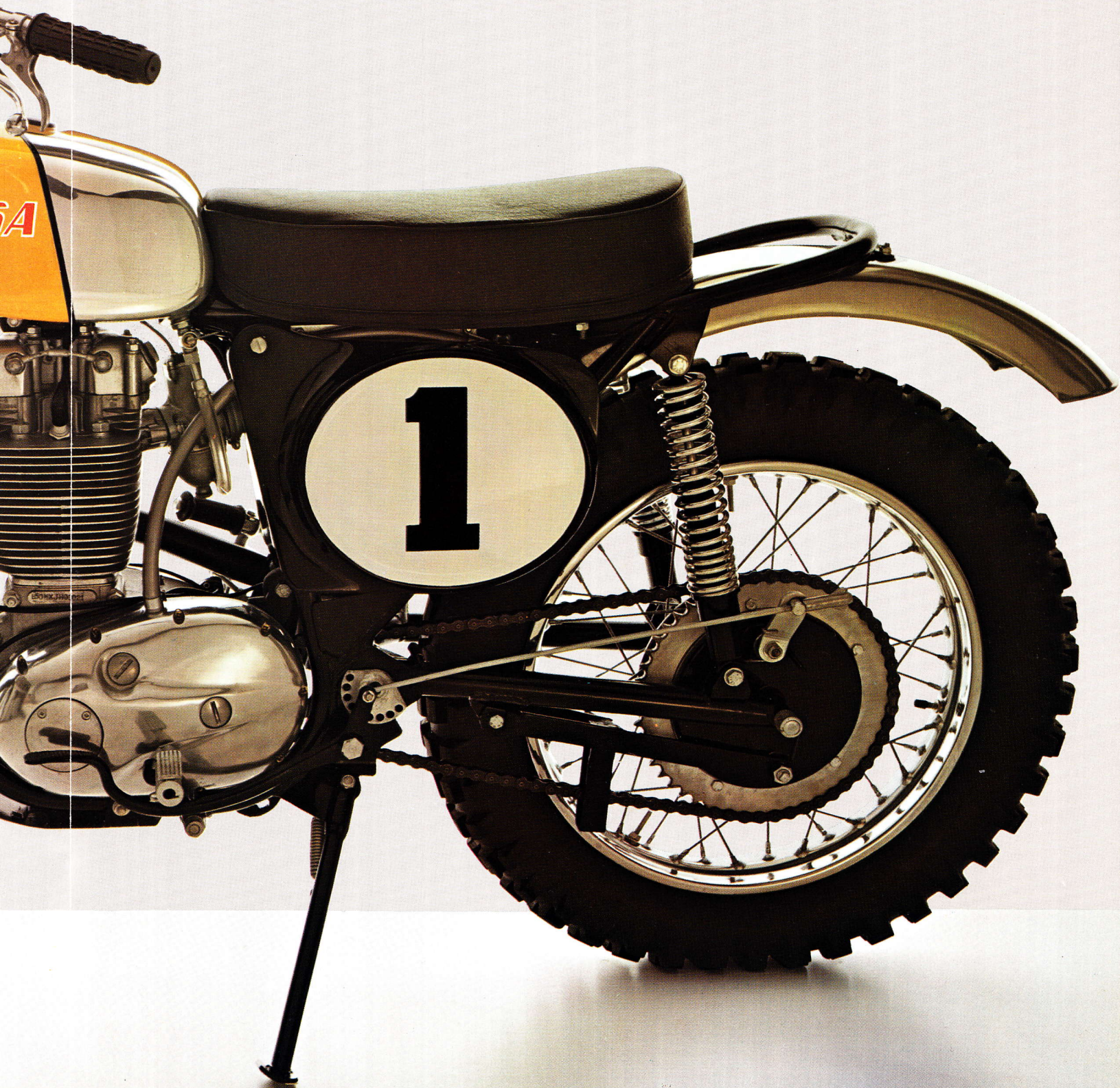

A polished aluminum alloy tank. Extremely light yet exceedingly strong. Just like the Victor itself.

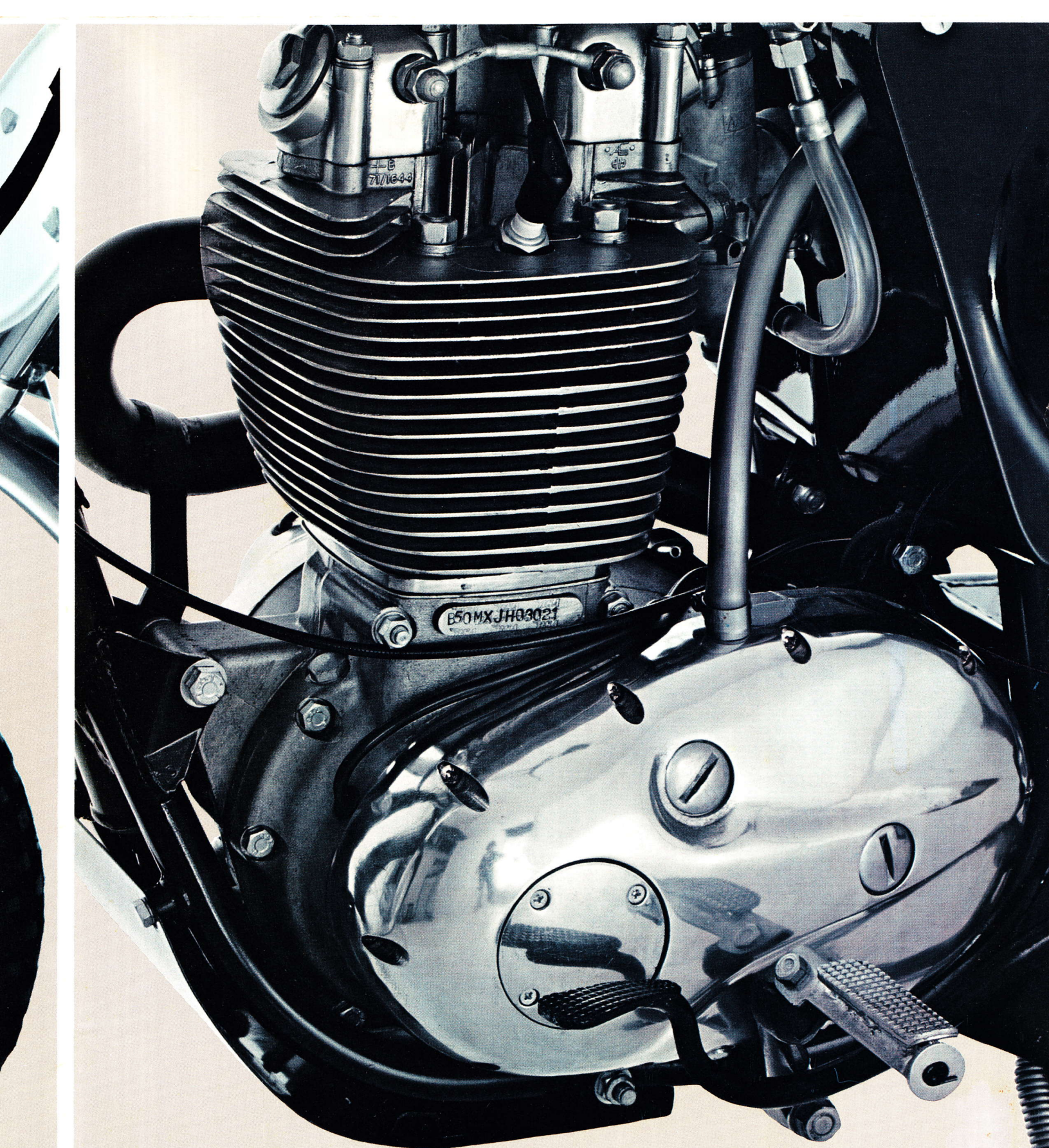
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Better performance from the Girling rear shocks,

And there's 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ " travel in the Motocross-proven front forks.

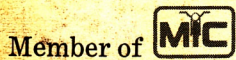
